Beginners Guide to Pantomime

Pantomime is always based on a traditional children's story (Snow White, Cinderella, Aladdin etc) and is usually performed around Christmas/January time.

The "dame" is almost always played by a man in drag and is always a larger than life character. Quite often other main characters are played by people of the opposite sex.

There is usually a lot of risqué double entendre often wringing innuendo out of perfectly innocent phrases. This is, in theory, over the heads of the children in the audience.

Characters will interact with the audience all through the pantomime. A response is ALWAYS required! This will include all of the following:

- When the baddy appears, you must boo her LOUDLY. Even before she speaks! And especially when she is rude to you...
- If a character says "Oh no I'm not!" you respond with "Oh yes you are!" And to "Oh yes it is!" you respond "Oh no it's not!" etc etc.
- If someone is sneaking about behind the characters on stage you shout "He/she's BEHIND you!" They will usually pretend not to hear you so you have to shout louder until they notice the person behind them.
- If a character asks you a question such as "You knew that, didn't you boys and girls?" you must answer loudly.
- You must sympathise with any characters that are feeling sorry for themselves

The chorus (or extras) often appear in multiple scenes (but as different characters) and perform a variety of songs and dances throughout the show.

Singing along with the sings you know is a MUST! There will be an audience participation song and there may well be a "sing off" between different parts of the audience, led by characters on stage. Tonight's song is "Summer Lovin" from Grease. The words are printed below so you have no excuse!!

There is always a happy ending with the baddy getting his/her comeuppance.

La Fondation a été créée à l'instigation de Janyce, jeune fille atteinte de leucémie en 1995 et de sa maman. Confrontées aux difficultés rencontrées par certaines familles dans leur lutte pour la survie de leur enfant, elles ont voulu leur apporter une aide concrete. C'est ainsi qu'est née la Fondation Janyce. Elle a pour but principal d'aider de manière rapide, sans formalités administratives compliquées et en principe sous forme de dons, des familles jetées dans des difficultés financières à la suite du diagnostic de cancer chez l'un des enfants. La Fondation peut également contribuer au financement de traitements et soins médicaux annexes, en complément aux caisses-maladies ou autres institutions (Ligues cantonales contre le cancer), ainsi qu'aux traitements dits expérimentaux qui ne seraient pas remboursés par les caisses mais recommandés par les spécialistes des centres d'Oncologie Pédiatrique de Suisse. L'aide de la Fondation s'adresse aux familles d'enfants cancéreux de toute la Suisse. La Fondation peut également apporter son aide financière, en principe sous forme de bourses, à des personnes souhaitant se former dans le domaine de l'oncologie pédiatrique pour prendre en charge par la suite, et ce pendant au moins 5 ans, des enfants cancéreux hospitalisés ou à domicile et nécessitant des soins spécialisés.

The Foundation was created in 1995 at the instigation of Janyce, a young girl with leukemia, and her mother. Confronted with the difficulties faced by families during the struggle for the survival of their children, they wanted to give them practical help. Thus was born the Fondation Janyce. Its main goal is to help families thrown into financial difficulties following the diagnosis of cancer in a child and to do so quickly without complicated paperwork. They do this by awarding grants. The Foundation may also contribute to the financing of medical care and treatment schedules, in addition to health insurance funds and other institutions (cantonal leagues against cancer), and so-called experimental treatments which would not normally be reimbursed by health insurance but which may be recommended anyway by specialists in paediatric oncology centres in Switzerland. The Foundation assists families of children with cancer from all over Switzerland. The Foundation may also provide financial assistance, mainly in the form of scholarships, to individuals wishing to train in the field of paediatric They also provide support for children with cancer who are hospitalised or at home and in need of specialised care for at least 5 years.
